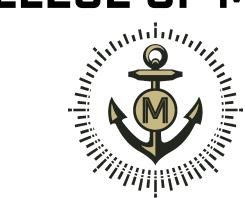

- Instructional Programs: Support continued development of student pathways, support completion of transfer level math and English

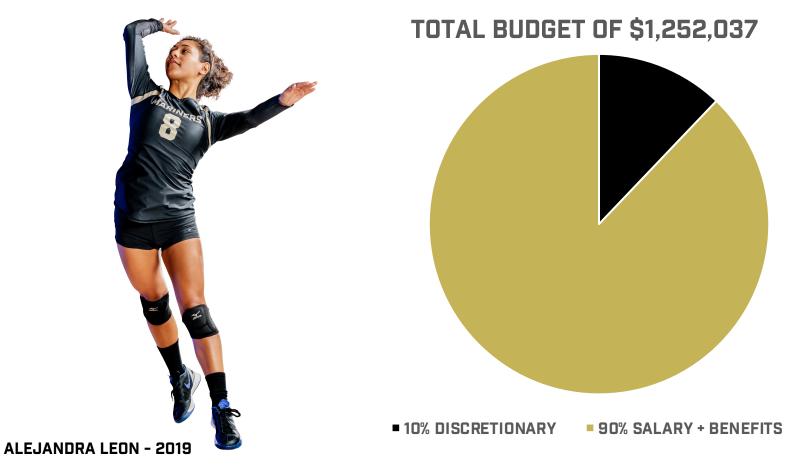

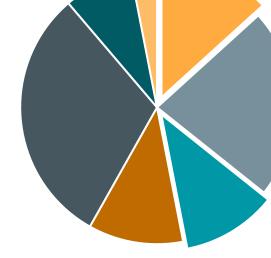

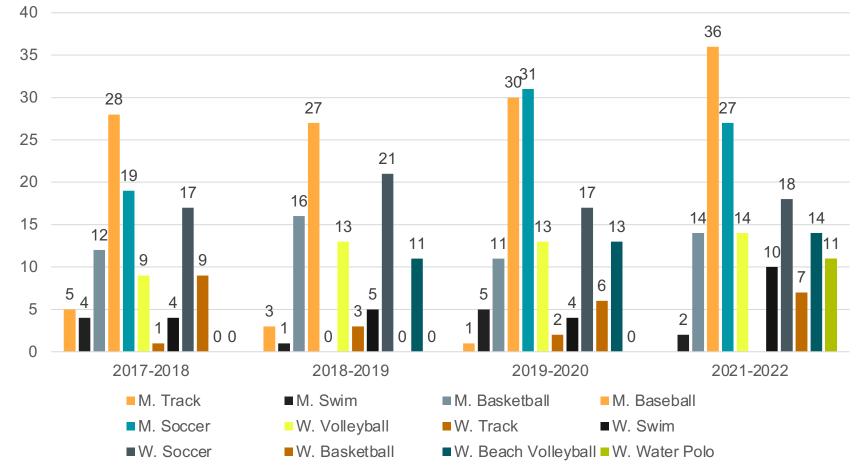




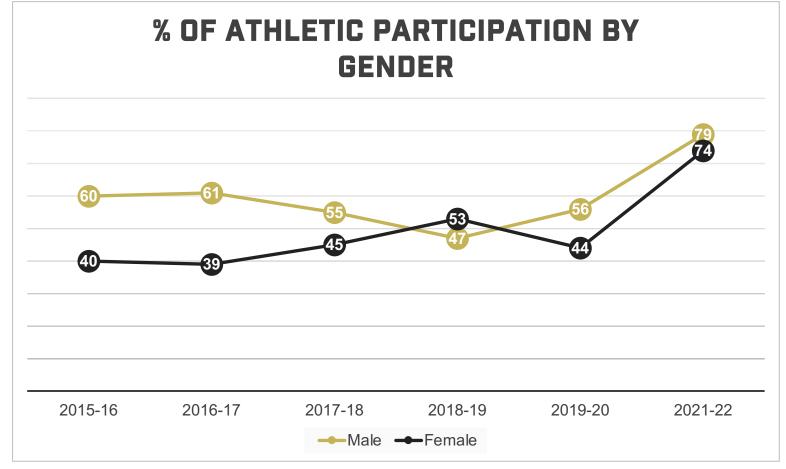

ATHLETICS ROSTER PARTICIPATION 2017-2022*



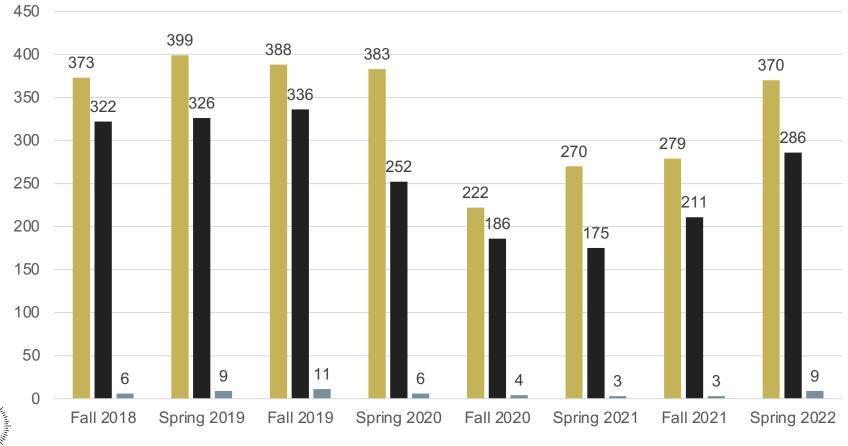

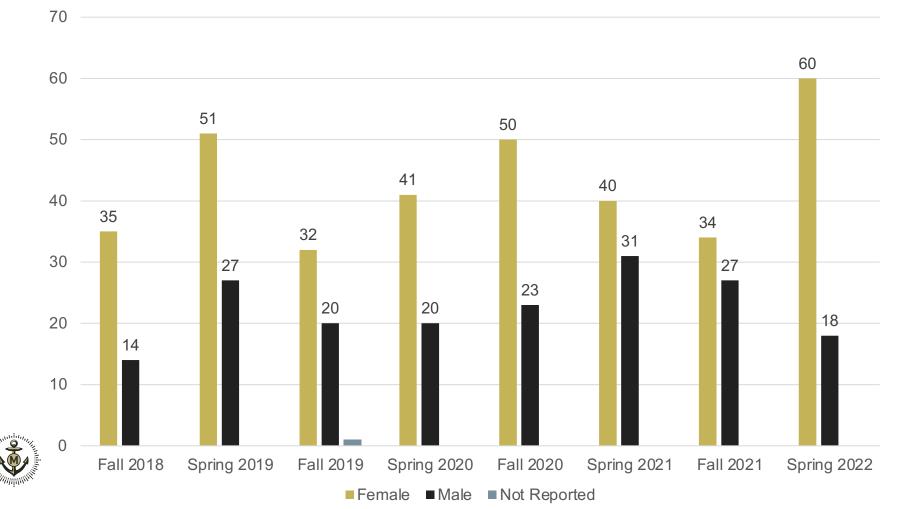
OF KINESIOLOGY STUDENTS FALL 2018-SPRING 2022



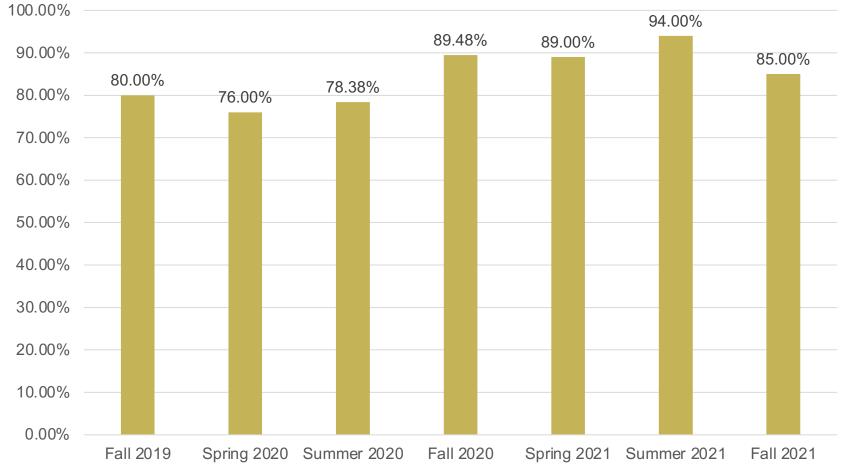

- Additional Services include personal care products, condoms and Band-Aids



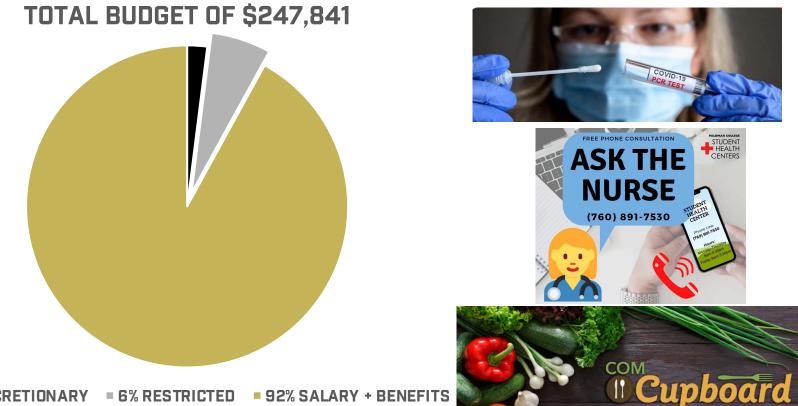

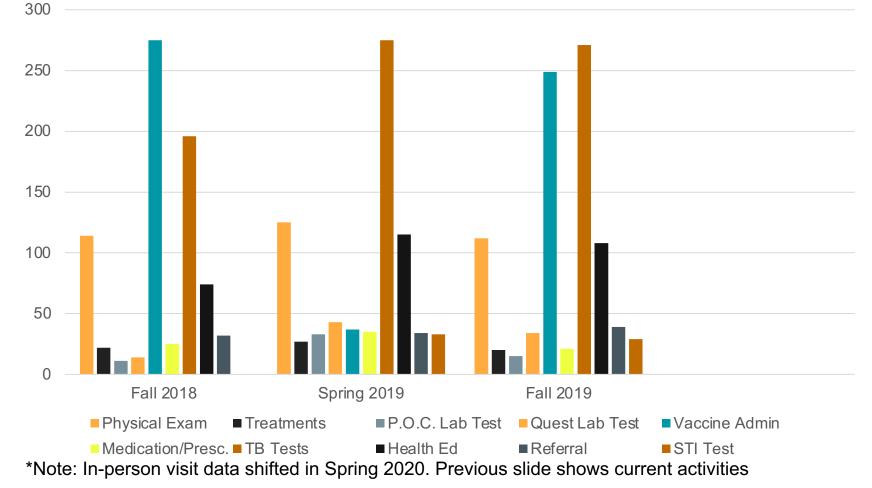

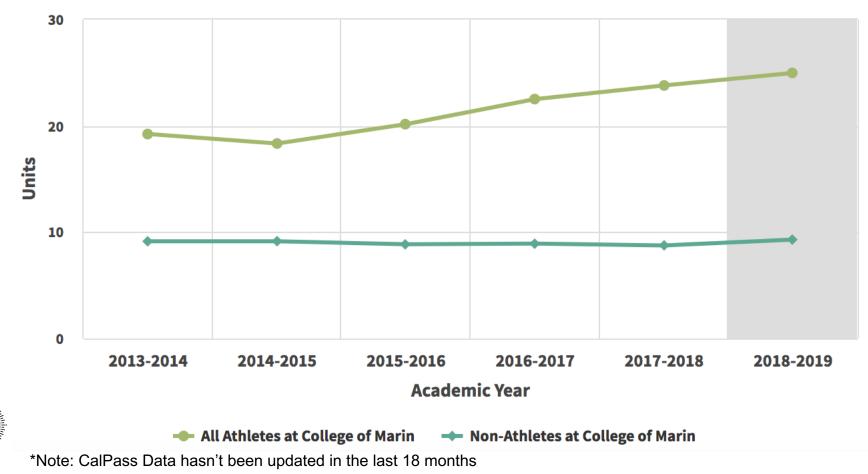
STUDENT HEALTH CENTER VISITS BY YEAR



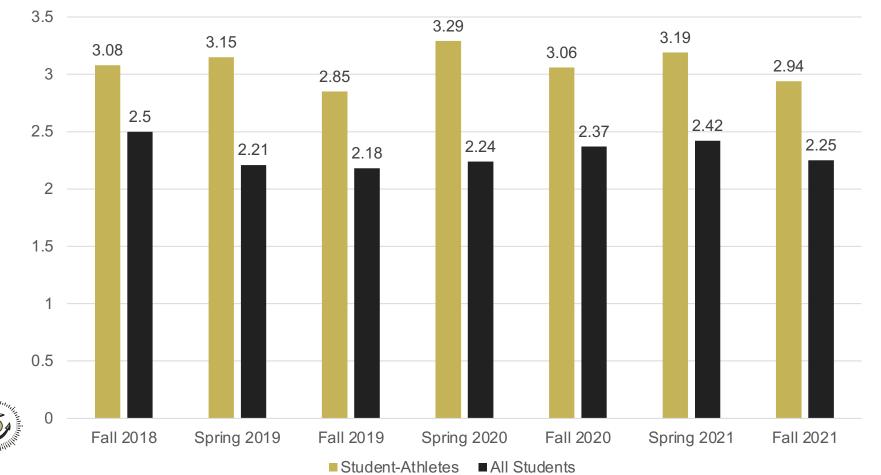

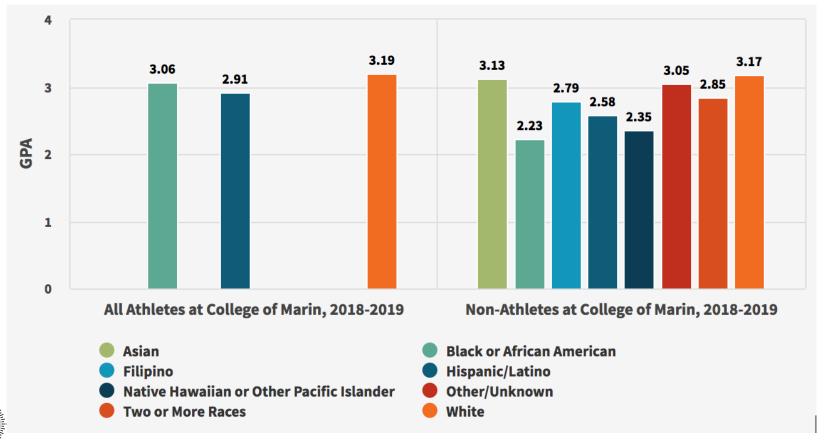
AVERAGE UNITS COMPLETED



GPA COMPARISON: STUDENT ATHLETES COMPARED TO ALL STUDENTS

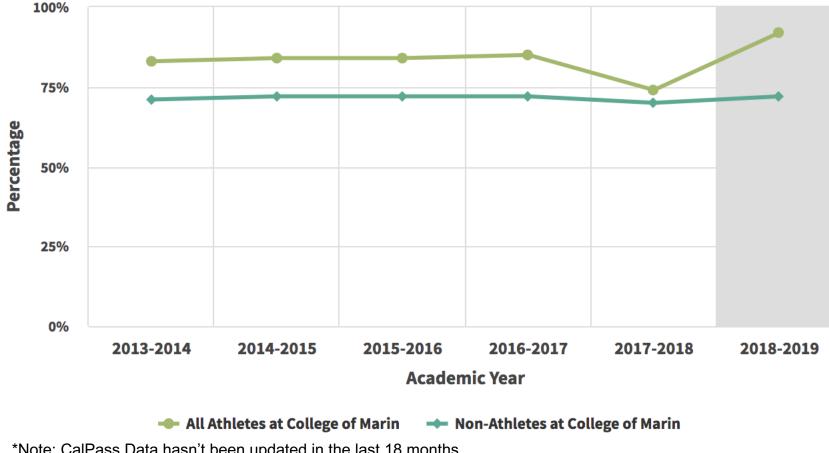


GRADE POINT AVERAGE



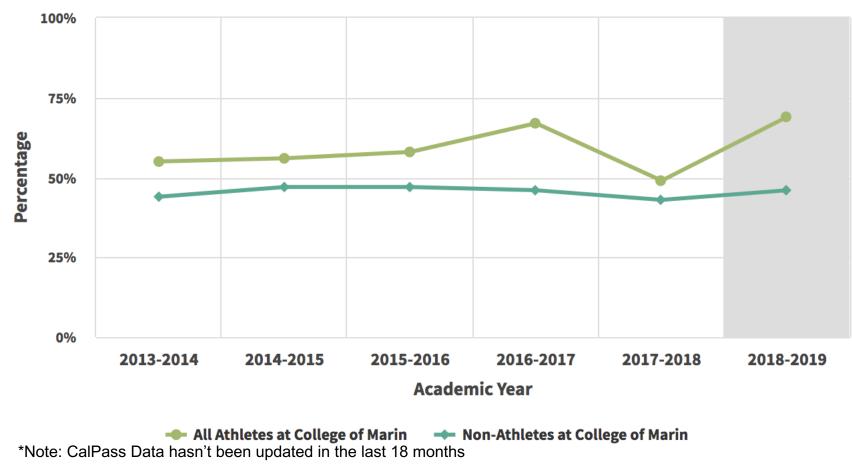

COMPLETED TRANSFER LEVEL ENGLISH



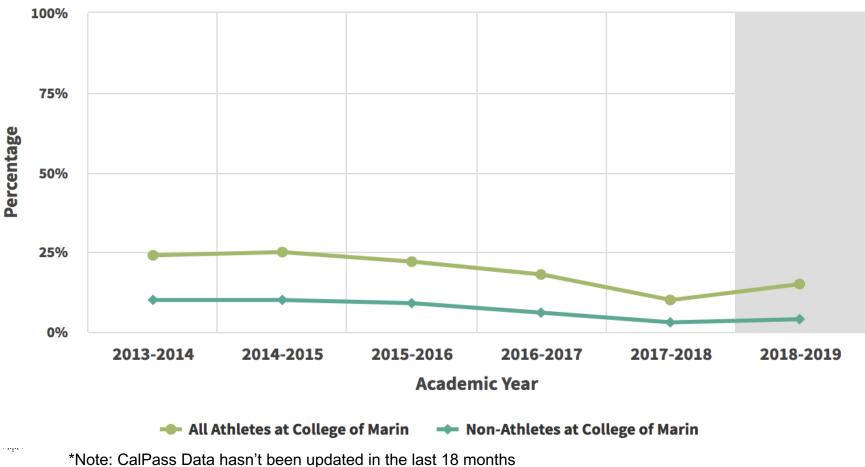

COMPLETED TRANSFER LEVEL MATH



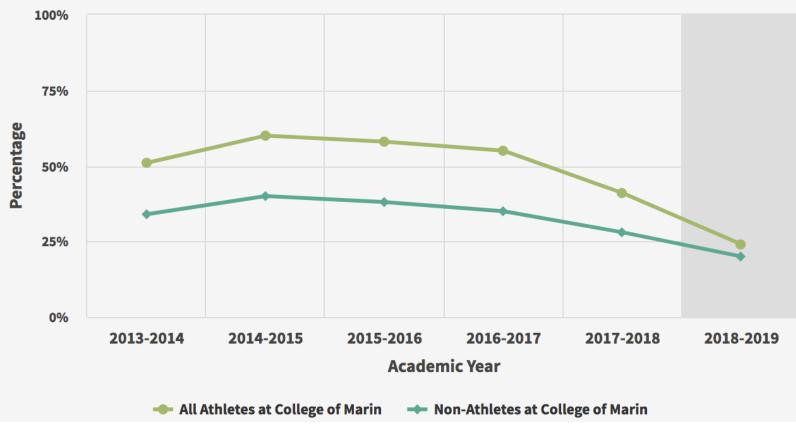

FT KIN INSTRUCTOR & HEAD MEN'S BASKETBALL COACH*

- #1 Recruiter of African American and/or Black male students on campus
- In the last 5 competitive season, 41 of the 66 roster spots for men's basketball have identified as Black and/or African American
- Full-time students with average GPA of 3.02 since Fall 2018
- Full-Time Head Coach would provide consistency, stability, recruitment, and ensure student success activities and engagement.



*No additional budget – Convert units from PT to FT



INCREASED HOURLY FUNDS FOR SUBSTITUTE ATHLETIC TRAINER





- Required for home contests for all sports
- Increased number of conflicts
- 2 sports at IVC, 7 sports at Kentfield
- Increased Non-Traditional Seasons



Request: \$5,600 (approximately 162 more hours per year x \$34.38) Provide Athletic Trainer Coverage when there is a conflict

INCREASED MEMBERSHIP FEES FOR CONFERENCES

Required for membership into conferences

- 7 sports hosted in the BVC
- Swim/Dive & Water Polo hosted by Coast Conf
- Beach Volleyball hosted by the Big 8
- All 3 have increased dues

Request: \$2,400 to cover increased dues for 3 conferences









TRANSPORTATION



Bay Valley Conference:

- Yuba and Mendocino
- Distances over 100 miles/3 hours round trip
- Length of day is a safety concern
 Details
- Some schedules can be shifted to double up
- Men's and women's basketball and men's and women's soccer can possibly double up
- No mechanic on campus
- Finding hourly drivers for shuttle busses has not been successful



Request: \$19,500 for teams to take Charter busses to Conference away game more than 100 miles one way – or 3 hours round trip. 9 trips x \$2,167 a trip.



SUPPLIES BUDGET

Uniforms and Practice Gear: 16% growth in participants

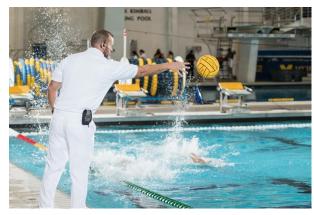






Request: \$2,000 above the 10% increase for uniforms and practice gear

MEAL \$ BUDGET

Meals on Away Games:

- We play about 100 road games per year
- 16% growth in participants
- Average meal from \$10 to \$12
- Faculty and Staff meal allowance is \$15 for lunch and \$25 per dinner











Request: \$3,600 above the 10% increase

SUMMARY

- Full-Time Faculty Position & Head Men's Basketball Coach (unit conversion)
- Hourly Substitute Athletic Trainer Request: \$5,600 (162 hours)
- Membership Dues Request: \$2,400 to cover increased dues for 3 conferences
- Transportation Request: \$19,500 for teams to take
- Charter busses to Conference away game more than 100 miles
- Instructional Supplies Request: \$2,000 above the 10% increase for uniforms and practice gear
- Officials Fees: \$2,500 increase
- Meal \$ Request: \$3,600 above the 10% increase
