The Emeritus Students College of Marin (ESCOM) was founded at the College of Marin in 1973 to pioneer using community colleges to provide lifelong learning to older adults in Marin; this program is cited as a national model.

There are no financial or educational requirements to join and the only requirement is a desire to learn, grow, share and enjoy!

We offer a rich variety of interactive and engaging programs, online and in person, including:

- 1. over 20 interest groups or "clubs,"
- 2. monthly speakers on local and international topics,
- 3. free computer workshops with the Commission on Aging,
- 4. a professional bi-monthly Journal of our members' writings and photography,
- 5. partners with Book Passage for author presentations,
- in-person events,
- presentations to large events like the Senior Fair and service provider groups, and
- 8. Inter-generational programs to support COM students.

We are an all-volunteer organization. All are free to join and all our programs and activities are free to our members.

ESCOM CONNECTS Activities

- 1. Business Department (2022) ...ESCOM panel presented about leadership. We shared about our careers and leadership experiences. Engaging Q & A conversation with the students.
- 2. Transfer and Career Center (2022 to present) tabling at career and industry fairs.
- 3. Tabling (2022 to present) at campus events attended by administration, faculty, staff and students.
- 4. Mapping Academic Pathways for Success (MAPS) (2023) participated in a speed career networking event.
- 5. Fall 2023...Lorrie (and Christie?) surveyed 76 students at various COM events to learn how ESCOM adult members could be of help to current COM students, in terms of job/career and success in school
- 6. Behavior Science Department (2023) ESCOM member interviewed by a COM student (single mother with three children who decided to go back to school) for her term project. Post interview, student received a scholarship from College of Marin to continue her studies in Psychology.
- 7. (2024) Presented a "brown bag" lunchtime presentation about interviewing to about 40 Behavior Science students
- 8. (2023) Helped ESL Students who have English as their second language practice their networking and job interviewing skills.
- 9. Nursing Department (2024)
 - Sat in on the orientation for 40 first time COM nursing students.
 - ESCOM member who was a midwife was available to students and the instructor to provide support throughout the Fall Semester.
- Athletic Department (2024) ESCOM member who has an extensive local to international sports management background shared his experiences with the Men's Basketball Team
 - Hosted a career panel for the Men's and Women's Basketball Teams. Panel members shared their career and life experiences and recommendations to help these student-athletes maximize their COM experience and as they move forward in their lives.

RESULTS: "ESCOM CONNECTS" STUDENT NEEDS SURVEY Executive Summary, Fall, 2023

SURVEY:

ESCOM CONNECTS members spoke with 76 COM students at the Fall, 2023 Resource Fair, ClubFest, and ASCOM Leadership meeting. The survey's overarching question:

"Members of ESCOM are active adults who have had experience with college and careers. They now continue to enjoy lifelong learning here at the COM.

How might ESCOM adults be of help to current COM students, in terms of jobs/careers and success in school?"

FINDINGS: On a scale from 0-5, where 0 = "no interest" and 5 = "much interest" . . .

1. Overall strong need for additional support

Students expressed strong needs in a full range of career and college topics, with 14 of the 21 survey items scoring an average score of 4.0 or higher.

2. Goal setting strongest need.

The two strongest needs addressed goal planning: long and short term goal setting (4.3 score) and planning your next steps after graduation (4.4).

3. Professors bring in ESCOM guests to discuss careers.

Re: preparation for jobs/careers, two of the strongest needs called for students' professors to invite ESCOM members to class to discuss their careers (4.2) and to help students prepare for interviews and resume writing (4.1).

Additionally, students expressed a strong interest in skills employees are looking for.

4. Drop-in centers to talk to adults other than family about school concerns.

Re: success in school, students expressed a strong interest in having an experienced person, other than family, to talk to on occasion (4.2). They also expressed a strong interest in a drop in center, where they could talk to someone about various school success topics (4.1).

Topics of most interest: study skills, time & money management, communication skills (each 4.1).

TAKE-AWAYS

- Professors can play a significant role in creating opportunities for students to meet with ESCOM members, either in class or outside of class.
- Student Service offices may wish to offer drop-in hours for ESCOM members to discuss specific topics with students (such as: study skills, money management, time management).
- Student Service offices may wish to offer workshops delivered by ESCOM members, addressing the topics of high student interest. (See full report for list of these topics.)
