Including Adults over 65 Years in the Vision 2030 document.

There are 6 million Californians over 65 who have graduated from school or retired from work, and are in need of the community outreach programs offered by our community colleges. This group is disproportionately likely to be low-income and to struggle with finding inspiring and engaging opportunities to make their lives as rich as possible. Many in this group have completed their work and education, but are living alone or in isolation, or want more from their lives.

The percent of California's population over 65 is now 16% in 2024 and expected to grow to 23% by 2040. If our efforts to increase access for older adults in California result in just 5% of the most motivated group becoming associated with Community Colleges, it would generate over 300,000 new community students and supporters across the system. Moreover, older adults are disproportionately the most likely both to be involved in community outreach programs and to support these programs personally and financially.

This work would generate tremendous gains for equitable access to higher education and community services. Redesigning opportunities for this population require dismantling the "traditional" architecture of the institution. Our institutions are uniquely positioned to help older adult Californians develop and utilize community services that benefit everyone, while returning the skills, knowledge and experience they have acquired in life to improve the social and economic mobility of everyone the community college system is designed to serve.
