### 6. Constituent Reports

#### Academic Senate

Academic Senate (AS) President Maria Coulson reported that an ad hoc multiconstituent group will form to apply for a Zero-Textbook-Cost (ZTC) Degree Grant to eliminate barriers to accessing education.

#### ASCOM

ASCOM President Emma Neal reported on the Club Fest (with 22 clubs represented), the Black History month event (1619 Project), and Women's History month event (with focus on equity and reproductive justice). The Lifter Society, a weightlifting club, had 70 students sign up and ASCOM will seek a request for funding to help sponsor gym memberships. Several students expressed interest to join the Citizen's Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC).

ASCOM elections take place March 29, with lots of applicants. The Council discussed policies for election posters on campus and to make sure the posters are removed after the campaign. In the past, many posters were forgotten and not taken down.

ASCOM officers look forward to attending the Student Senate for California Community Colleges (SSCCC) will hold its <u>general assembly</u> on March 31- April 2, in Long Beach, with statewide student senate representation.

Mia asked if there is student interest to serve on the Campus Policing and Public Safety Advisory Council. She seeks three students to join the council. Emma reported that several students have expressed interest but need additional information about the time and date commitments.
