Clarification is needed on the table headers in the English/Math placement tables.

Further information is needed on AB705 and its impact on the objective and performance indicator.

Champion Objective Presentations

Objective SS 4.1: Increase percentage of students advancing from pre-college level courses to college-level courses by 2018.

- Multiple measures has placed more students in transfer-level courses.
- HUM 101 and MATH 103IN piloted, ENGL 62 and MATH 85 were eliminated in Fall 2017; ESL mirror courses have been expanded to include ESL 53 through ESL 76 and ESL 86.
- AB705 requires multiple measures placement and that colleges maximize the probability that a student will enter and complete transfer-level English or math within a one year

timeframe. COM will have only one level below transfer-level English and math by Fall 2019.

- Supplemental instruction, corequisites, curricular changes are all being considered in the context of guided pathways.
- AB705 and related initiatives should be considered when developing the educational master plan.

Objective SS 1.1: Increase institutional preparedness to address student equity.

- The employee survey and action steps demonstrate that there has been an increase in awareness of and participation in training around student equity.
- Training opportunities are now becoming more focused on certain topics such as equitable hiring and equity in the classroom.

Objective SS 1.3: Increase the percentage of degree, certificate and/or transfer-seeking students who earn at least 30 units within three years starting with Fall 2014 entering cohort and the two subsequent entering cohorts.

- The action step has largely been achieved and an integrated student success/equity/BSI plan is now in place.
- Christina will check on the baseline wording.
- The data for this objective needs to be investigated further. A yes/no rating will be done at the next EPC meeting.

Objective CR 1.1: Engage community and economic development partners to participate in the assessment of industry and community demands for workforce and economic development.

The findings will be shared with the campus community.

- CTE employees have presented to a number of organizations over the last year, shared information with the campus community, and convened advisory committee meetings.
- CTE regularly examines the local and regional workforce along with economic development indicators.
- COM engages in many joint ventures with other colleges and programs unique to the region.

Objective SS 3.1: Institutional/programmatic decisions reflect sound data and analysis of factors impacting student success.

- PRIE routinely tracks indicators and outcome measures such as those for the strategic plan, Scorecard, ACCJC reports, and the Fact Book.
- Much of the work done last year was proactive so departments could have information to work from. This year, more requests have been received in-house and the results have been largely shared internally.
- PRIE collaborates with, presents to, and provides data for departments across the College.
