### **1. Concerning issues around access, retention, and success of students**

- A. Data points are unclear in program review and do not align with PRIE data.
  - 1. It is unclear how many students are in the program any given year.
  - 2. Persistence rate by race and ethnicity also unclear.

- C. Disparity in gender, race, and ethnicity enrollment, persistence, and retention.
- D. Schedule of class offerings is not meeting the needs of populations in Marin County and the community.

  - 3. Exploration of new technology
