Update Charge and Responsibilities	Discussion	Sadika: PRAC and EPC working on different definitions of anti-racism. They'd like IDEA, EEO and Umoja to look at it. Julian: EPC is adding questions to prompt champions about what they are doing to prevent racism on campus. Yashica: Process question: Any of shared governance committees can propose a definition and then it goes Shared Governance for approval? Sadika: PRAC is overarching and have final approval, but they want it vetted by our areas and Umoja. We are advisory council to President so we'd like to see definitions before they go to other committees. Colleen: Patty and I sit on PRAC. Not discussed yet, want to hear from others, especially Walter and Umoja. Sadika: We have expertise in this group. This proposal of what definition might be would be helpful.



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		Tea: Do you want to send to members to review, give it time? We can check in at next meeting? Sadika: I'll do that – it is DRAFT – please don't share wider than necessary. Send feedback directly me. Tea: What changes would people like to make, adjust, add to Charge? One of Dr. Coon's first points was to have the college and campus wide acknowledge to recognize, acknowledge, and name that higher education is rooted in in white supremacy. Do we want to include that? Add language about anti-racism, anti-blackness, white supremacy? Tea: Each of us on IDEA committee serves on other committees, do we want to add language around that? Also, the name of this committee is buzz words that don't identify what we do, that is why Charge is so important. Yashica: Language should include definitions: Inclusion means:, Equity means:, Equity means:, keep our Charge nimble. We have the first part, supporting the college's commitment, maybe immediately following that we offer up the definitions of inclusion diversity, equity, and action
		Tea: A sentence. This committee will focus on initiatives rooted in social justice. Does that cover it? Tea: Homework: Come up with definitions. Review highlighted areas (of Charge).



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		Patty: People can add their ideas to the highlighted part and then next time we look at all those suggestions and clarify it.
		Hellen: We talked last week about each IDEA member being on a Participatory Governance Committee. Are we aiming for it to be a requirement?
		Hugo: Maybe just when possible include representation in Participatory Governance or include IDEA committee representation and Participatory Governance committees.
		Sadika: Some positions are appointed. Can serve as resource, non-voting. Provide guidance, insight, questions.
