Review Charge and Responsibilities	Discussion	Tea: I was researching definitions that capture what we do. It's a draft and I want your input.
		Sadika: Making sure that we do that this with Dr. Coon, since we are as advisory council, before adopting them as final.
		Colleen: I know we don't want to list every identity, but could we add gender?
		Hellen: Suggestion: should we change, awareness to accountability? Sometimes awareness is overused.
		Sadika: Can you put "to cultivate a culture of accountability and action"?
		Tea: I used the equity lens, making sure that it's centering those that are often excluded or might be present but aren't feeling a sense of belonging or are often silenced. Thoughts?
		Sadika: We are providing professional development. We could add awareness. I want



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		to be mindful of how people are entering into the space, not everyone is ready.
		Tea: Can folks working with Umoja, before our next meeting, add some language that's consistent with that? I get a thumbs up. Thanks
		Tea: One recommendation was to create systems of accountability for all these recommendations.
		Hugo: It says accountability plan for each of the recommendations.
		Sadika: Name the plan here because then there is a there's something that we're upholding. It is in line with the call to action from the chancellor's office. Do we want to call it a call to action? Does it becomes redundant?
		Tea: Were you recommending to add an implementation of anti-racist practices?
		Sadika: Are we talking about being a convening body? I think that's an important part of this. Is it assessing and recommending?
		Patricia: It should be separate. You can still convene and assess separately.
		Sadika: For number two: "Convene responsible parties working on equity related efforts at the college to discuss alignment, accountability and implementation of anti-racism practices to improve the calm environment for students and employees."



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		Sadika: That aligns it more with the recommendations that went to the President.
		Further discussion on the role of IDEA committee members as a resource on other committees. Discussion about using anti-racist and not naming gender, religion, sexual identity, etc. An unintended consequence. Use anti-racist and equity. Concern that if we are seeking to have committee membership on campus reflect student body, especially historically underrepresented groups, individuals will be spread thin trying to be on multiple committees.
		Sadika: Ensure anti-racism is established and integrated as a core commitment and approach.
		Tea: If we add in the Umoja Institute language to have consistency there and then could folks give another review before next meeting. Does that sound good? We did a lot of great work this morning. Thank you
