Conduct data-driven assessment of instructional and non-instructional use of facilities to determine optimal utilization across both campuses.

Community Programs has played a vital role in supporting students, staff, and the community through various initiatives, including Community Education classes at IVC, facility rentals, and farm integration. The optimization of utilization is evident in several key areas: - Collaboration with the Workforce Department and Workforce Alliance of the North Bay on the IVC Campus. - Renovation and organization efforts, such as cleaning out IVC building 12, setting up new offices for Community Programs in building 9, updating inventory at the Jonas Center, organizing facility barns and event supplies, and assisting with various moves and setups. - Multiple facility rentals for athletic fields, pools, parking lots, Nugget kitchen, and more. Challenges: Insufficient collaboration in optimizing the utilization of the Miwok Aquatic and Fitness Center. Daytime usage is underutilized, and there is a shortage of hourly staff/lifeguards. While Community Programs has effectively established and provided a diverse range of programs, classes, and facility usage at IVC, the primary challenge lies in if this is a college priority.



Align facilities capacity and utilization with program/course needs to ensure integrated facilities and instructional planning/use.

- Launch of Adult Lap Swim in January 31, 2023, with 922 different swimmers and significant pass sales. - Successful hosting of the Speedo Sectionals Swim Meet in March 2023 with over 500 attendees. It went so well we are hosting again in spring 2024 and summer 2024 - Introduction of Miwok Fitness Center memberships, including options for fitness and swim, as well as fitness center-only memberships. - Hosting 36 different aquatic events and accommodating 25 different aquatic renters. - Inclusion of the IVC Farm under Community Programs, starting an internship program with the ARC, and exploring grant collaboration for an Indigenous healing/medicine garden. - Hosting Special Olympics practice starting in November 2023 and conducting several farm tours in partnership with Community Education. - The Jonas Center served 43 organizations and 19 individual groups.



Establish revenue-generating contract education and other opportunities that serve existing area needs (continuing-professional education, specialized workforce training, fee-based K-8 camps).

- Community Education collaborated with Career Education in the Certified Nurses Aid Program. - Community Education served over 3,300 different students, with 6,500 registered participants, offering 471 classes, with approximately 100 classes on the IVC campus. - Hosting a variety of Culinary Classes in partnership with Nugget kitchen, supported by grants.
