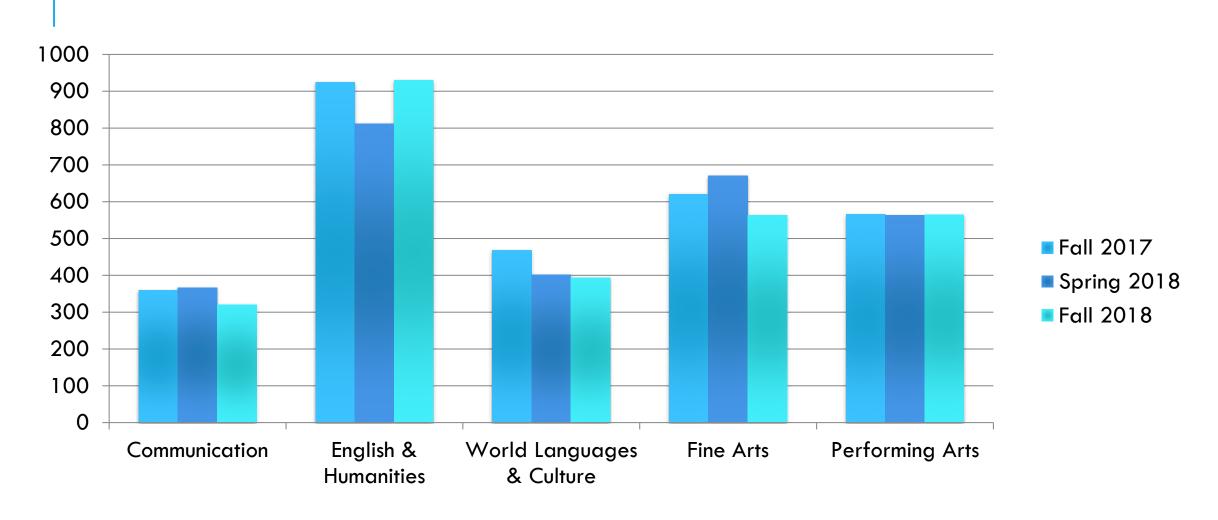

#### Public Performances

- **Music** Oratorio, College Chorus, Chamber Singers, Symphony Orchestra, Symphonic Band, Jazz Ensemble, Brass Ensemble, Opera =  $\sim 26$  performances/semester both on & off campus.
- The Orchestra has grown by 50% in the last four years to fill virtually all seats with students; the audience has doubled from prior years; program donations have increased roughly 5x over!

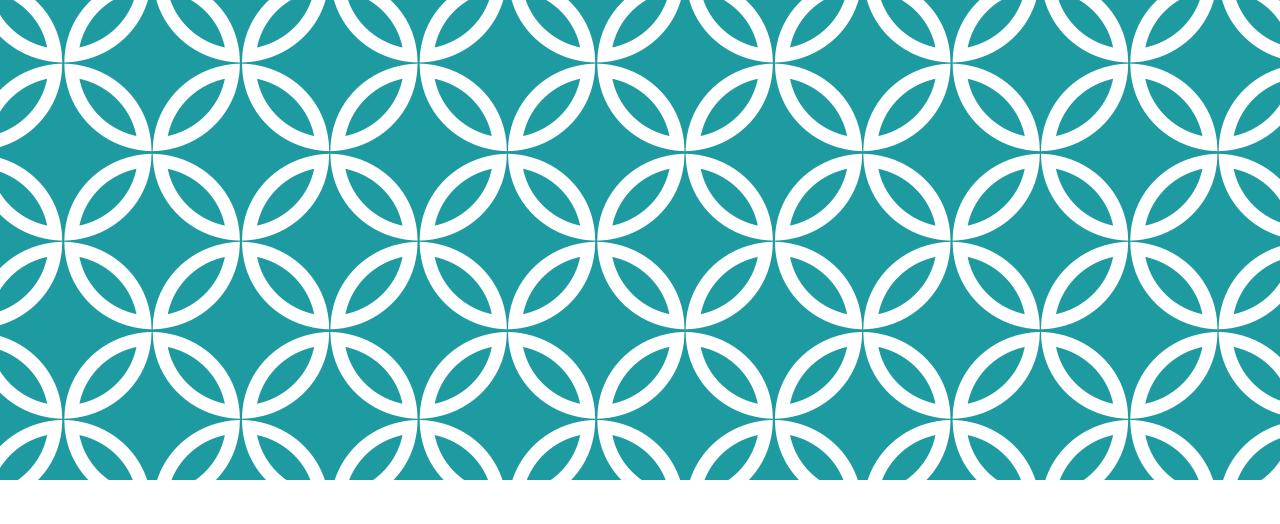
